

Bachelor of Science in Psychology

Psychology is a science. The BS degree in psychology emphasizes math and science skills in the curriculum. All students receive training in general theories, statistical principles, and research methods so they can be prepared for careers in psychology and related fields.

Bachelor of Art in Psychology

The BA degree in psychology allows students to take foreign language credit hours to enrich their curriculum. Essentially, psychology is a science. All students receive training in general theories, statistical principles, and research methods so they can be prepared for careers in psychology and related fields.

Psychology Minor

The psychology minor is a great supplement to other majors in that it enhances understanding of human relationships, interactions, and behavior. Both the major and the minor are flexible, allowing students to customize the degree to meet their individual educational goals.

Criminal Psychology Minor

The criminal psychology minor is a 21-credit hour minor for students who are interested in gaining a basic understanding of the criminal justice system, criminal psychology vs. victimology, and current forensic law.

The Master of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies

A unique degree program that allows students to study in multiple disciplines and see the interconnectedness of those disciplines. Students are required to complete a minimum of 36 credit hours in either two or three fields of study. Courses are delivered asynchronously online.

Bachelor of Social Work (47 Credits)

San Juan College students graduating with an associate degree in human services with a minimum of a 2.5 GPA are guaranteed admission into the School of Social Work.

Advanced Standing Master of Social Work (39 Credits)

Students who have earned a BSW from a CSWE-accredited institution, in the last 8 years with a 3.0 GPA are eligible for WNMU's Advanced Standing MSW.

Non-Advanced Standing Master of Social Work (60 Credit Hours)

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applying to the B.S.W. program is easy, and we accept applications year-round.

Applicants to the program should meet the following criteria:

- be admitted to Western New Mexico University
- have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average

FIELD PRACTICUM

The BSW Program at WNMU includes two semesters of Field Practicum in the BSW curriculum, each requiring 225 field hours. In the fall and spring semesters (usually around 16 weeks) students complete 15 hours at the agency weekly and 1 hour of mandatory face to face class time.

ACCREDITATION

The BSW program has been accredited by CSWE since 2000. The BSW program was reaffirmed in October 2020.





Millennium III Honors Program

The WNMU Millennium III Honors Program serves students in all majors and minors with enriched courses and activities for bright, highly-motivated students.

Admission to the Honors Program is “rolling.” This means that we will make decisions concerning acceptance into the Honors Program as applications are received.

1. Applicant must apply and be accepted as a WNMU student.
2. Applicant must complete an Honors Program Application form.
3. Students must maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5. A student whose cumulative GPA falls below the required level will be placed on probation.
4. Students must complete at least two honors courses, seminars or colloquiums each academic year during their first two years in the Honors Program.
5. Students must maintain their full-time student status. (12 credits per semester)
6. Students are required to participate in an initial “in-gathering” event at the beginning of each academic year and other occasional designated Honors activities.

To graduate through the Millennium III Honors Program, students must complete twenty-four credit hours of honors courses. Of these twenty-four credit hours, program participants must also take three credits of ACAD 198 Seminar and ACAD 398 Colloquium. There are four basic types of classes offered in this program:

1. **Honors sections of General Education classes** - For transfer students, these are the honors courses you took as part of your associate's degree.
2. **HNRS 1210, or ACAD 398 seminars and colloquiums** - The philosophy behind these courses is to provide honors students with experiential forms of learning outside the classroom. The program of study requires students to take at least three of these classes, which are one-credit hour each.
3. **Contract Courses** - Honors students can make a pre-existing class into an honors class. This involves signing a ‘contract’ between the student and an instructor willing to do the course. It should involve the honors student doing something that is academically uplifting, experiential, and uniquely tailored towards the student's intellectual interests. Some ideas include: giving a lecture in class, leading discussion groups, reading a different set of books, doing a poster presentation, reading a paper at an academic conference, etc.
4. **Upper-Level Classes** - These courses are offered to help students complete their 24 credits of honors classes, at the same time as they finish additional, upper-level coursework to finish their 128 credits hours for their baccalaureate degree.



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


